GRIZZLY FLATS ALTERNATE ROUTES OUT OF THE COMMUNITY SIGNS

It's best to become familiar with all possible routes out of the community **before** the emergency occurs!

Take time to drive each of the routes during good weather (past the snow season when all the routes are clear and open).

Knowing the roads well during daylight hours and non-smoke conditions will help if you have to evacuate at night during smoke and fire conditions.

The El Dorado County Sheriff's Office- Office of Emergency Services Alert Notification System provides a number of ways in which the county may contact the community in the event of an emergency such as: evacuations due to wildfires or hazardous material spills, or urgent law enforcement operations.

The El Dorado County Office of Emergency Services partnered with CodeRED emergency notification service to alert residents and businesses by telephone, cell phone, text message, email, and social media when there is a threat to the health or safety of residents.



DESIGNED TO ASSIST IN UNDERSTANDING ALTERNATE WAYS OUT OF THE COMMUNITY

If there is a situation where the community of Grizzly Flats needs to utilize an alternate route out of the community, there will be an announcement made for citizens to take the necessary route that will be indicated in the alert.

The main ways out of Grizzly Flats are String Canyon and Grizzly Flat Road. There are currently two labeled route options: (1) The Capps Crossing Route and (2) the Leoni Route.
